TO SAY LESS IS TO SAY MORE

In a time when socialism is the rage among students, I feel compelled to write about "communism" and "socialism," which are terms commonly used by our students. It is not necessary to go into lengthy discussions of these two concepts or to define them as the "class" "bourgeoisie." It is better for you and for all of us to speak in plain English and to define the words in simple terms. When they speak in terms of "class" and "bourgeoisie" they speak the language of the masses.

It is only because we have grown up in a society where the masses are not given as much attention as they deserve that we use these terms. It is not a matter of pride, but a matter of respect and understanding for the masses. It is better to be called a "communist" than to be called a "bourgeoisie" because the latter is a term that is used to describe the ruling class.

It is possible to use the term "socialism" to describe the movement of the masses. The masses are not a class but a movement. It is not necessary to go into lengthy discussions of these two concepts or to define them as the "class" "bourgeoisie." It is better for you and for all of us to speak in plain English and to define the words in simple terms.

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
